Township of SNNF - Digital Signs

The Township of Sioux Narrows-Nestor Falls maintains two digital signs in the municipality. One is located adjacent to the Northern Ontario Sportfishing Center in Sioux Narrows, and the other is adjacent to the Nestor Falls Municipal Office/Library in Nestor Falls.

These signs are used for advertising municipal programs (such as how to obtain fire permits), municipal facility hours of operation (such as libraries & landfills), and messages related to the safety of the community (such as Fire Hazard status). The signs are also used to advertise community based events.

Any community group wishing to advertise their event may contact the Municipal Office with all the pertinent details of the event and an add can be displayed. Unfortunately, private business advertising is not allowed.

Why it is important to report crimes – no matter how minor.

I don't know how many times during the course of my career that I have heard members of the public say they had been the victim of a crime but never reported it to police. Some reasons people don't report — "the police are too busy dealing with "real" emergencies and crimes", "nothing was taken", "I didn't want to bother them", "the persons responsible will never get caught anyway" or "nothing happens to the people when they do get caught".

Although some of these statements are true – *every* crime – *no matter* how insignificant you may think it is – *should* be reported to police. The reason is simple – police *cannot* do anything if it is not reported. In addition – most people would not know if similar crimes have been committed. If police are aware of a crime trend, there are targeted responses that can be utilized to catch perpetrators.

So if you are the victim of a crime – please don't think twice about whether or not you should contact the police – just do it. To make it easier, The Ontario Provincial Police has an online incident reporting system called Citizen Self Reporting (CSR). This system is for members of the public to report selected incidents via the Internet. Using the CSR, specific incidents can be reported online without attending a detachment or waiting for an officer.

The applicable calls for service which fall within the CSR online reporting parameters include:

- Theft under \$5,000
- Mischief/ Damage to Property Under \$5,000
- Mischief/Damage to Vehicle Under \$5,000
- Theft from Vehicle
- Lost/Missing Property (including licence plates)

Do not use the system if you have an emergency. If you prefer, you may still contact the OPP by phone to report a crime or have an officer attend. The 24 hour OPP toll free number is 1-888-310-1122.

To access the website, visit opp.ca and click on the Citizen Self Reporting icon. This will take you to a secure link where there are instructions how to fill out the report.
