Smoke and CO Alarms

Smoke alarms are one of the easiest and most effective ways to detect fires early which saves lives and structures. It is the law for all Ontario homes to have a working smoke alarm on every storey including basements and crawlspaces where necessary and outside all sleeping areas. This covers single family, semi-detached and town homes, whether owner-occupied or rented. Abide by the law, to learn more, visit website: Ontario.ca/fire-safety-home

Important information to note about smoke detectors is:

1. There should be at least one on every storey of a multi storey house including basements or crawlspaces.

- 2. There should be one in every bedroom.
- 3. There should be one between bedrooms and the rest of the house.
- 4. They should be located near the ceiling.
- 5. Change the batteries when you change your clocks in the spring and fall.
- 6. Dust can clog an alarm so gently vacuum them every 6 months.
- 7. They do wear out so replace them every 10 years.
