M. Reported that there were 2,340 walk-ins at the Sportfishing Centre in June, which is up by 583 compared to last year. The Veteran's Memorial Park dedication event on Saturday brought in an estimated additional 200 people. The total walk-ins that day were 370. Dock fees were up overall in June compared to last year as well.

P. Hudson – reported that the Nestor Falls Information Centre had 423 walk-ins in June.
